I saw three pictures recently that I want to tell you about. I showed them to some of you in interviews. The first one, was two of our missionaries standing at the font in Arabkir with two others in spitak. One of them was a son and the other was his mother who the Elders taught and the son baptized. The son had been less active until the Elders reached out in love and rescued him, bringing him back to the covenant he had made years before. Now his mother has made that same covenant and his non-member uncle is coming to FHE at the mission home next week. This kind of missionary work must please the Lord even more than it pleases me. The second picture was one brought to me by a returned missionary from Armenia that we served with in Ukraine. She came to see me to renew her recommend and handed me an envelope. Inside was a photo of a man we met the first week of our mission in Ukraine. I woke up in the middle of that night with a distinct impression that I must get to know this man. I got out of bed and wrote his name in my planner. He was baptized in the Dneper River just exactly 7 years to the date after his wife had been baptized. At work in the office, we received a printout of the year's baptismal records in Armenian. President Carter asked me to compare them with the records that I have kept on my computer in English. I asked an Armenian to help me. He looked over the records and did the best he could but it wasn't complete. Toward the end of the day I felt like I needed to continue to work on it. I had no one to help me at this point. I started to try and go over the names letter by letter in Armenian and compare it to the English record. I really surprised myself as I was able to pronounce the names written in Armenian and then find them written in English! As I progressed on, the thought occurred to me that it was because I have been reading the Book of Mormon that I was able to do this. I was able to read the Armenian names well enough to complete this work without finding someone to do it for me. I really felt like the Lord was directing me! I felt the Spirit confirm that to me and it was a feeling of gratitude and peace.
