PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE





Dear Elders and Sisters,

We have had two great zone conferences during the past two weeks. Thank you for your interest and participation. As promised, I'd like to remind you of some of the things we spoke to you about in zone conference.

"Arise, shine; for thy light is come, and the glory of the Lord is risen upon thee" (Isaiah 60:1). Miles Coverdale's (1488-1569) translation of the same verse is... "Get thee up and be illuminated..." We become "illuminated" when we become intellectually or spiritually enlightened.

It seems the Lord is telling us to do at least two important things; first, to get up and get going and second, to become intellectually and spiritually enlightened. This sounds like excellent advice to me.

In the Doctrine and Covenants, the Lord declares... "He that is slothful shall not be worthy to stand" (D&C 107:100). As you recall, slothful is defined as a "disinclination to action or labor." A synonym is "indolence" which means spiritual apathy or inactivity.

The opposite of slothful is "diligent." The Lord tells us in the Doctrine and Covenants to..."Let every man [and woman] be diligent in all things" (D&C 75:29). A person who is diligent displays steady, earnest, and energetic effort. A diligent person is "intelligently enthusiastic" about the essential things of life.

From time-to-time is beneficial to conduct a personal inventory---to determine how we are doing. In doing so, I suggest we ask ourselves the following questions:

How diligent am I?

Could I be more diligent?

Should I be more diligent?

How can I become more diligent?

When will I become more diligent?

A careful pondering and an honest and sincere evaluation of our standing with the Lord are guaranteed to help us make necessary course corrections in our lives. Elder Sterling W. Sill once stated: "Woe to him who has lost his initiative. Woe to him who develops battle fatigue. Woe to him who does nothing. The Law says, 'Get thee up and be illuminated.' The alternative is to stay down and be eliminated, for spiritual death is banishment from the presence of God."

In order to "be illuminated" we must possess the quality of "intelligent enthusiasm." It has been said that "the difference between a mud puddle and gauzier is enthusiasm."

The power is in us as children of God to overcome our "natural selves" and not need to be compelled in all things "...for he that is compelled in all things, the same is a <u>slothful</u> and not a wise servant; wherefore he receiveth no reward. Verily I say, men should be <u>anxiously engaged</u> in a good cause, and do many things of their own free will, and bring to pass much righteousness. For the <u>power</u> is in them..." (D&C 58:26-28).

Preach My Gospel teaches us that our authority comes from our setting apart and our <u>power</u> comes from our personal worthiness (page 4). It is my prayer that we will consistently "get...up and be illuminated." The Lord has so commanded and he has endowed us with the power to do so.
