President's Message

Dear Elders and Sisters,

I recently read a small book titled "Becoming The Bold Missionary" by George Durrant. I would like to share a few thoughts from it with all of you. The book teaches about seeking to be "spiritually bold." This type of boldness is not "self-confidence" it is "Christ-confidence." It is not "look at me" boldness, instead it is "look to the Savior" boldness. It is not "trust me" boldness, it is "trust Him" boldness. When you feel His Spirit, you will confidently and boldly speak His words in His name. You will know that the Lord will back you up when you declare His truths in meekness. My favorite thought of the entire book was "Meekness will come as you sense that the power you have in your words is not a power WITHIN you, but rather it is a power which God sends THROUGH you." The Lord will put a thought in your heart, and as you voice that thought, the Holy Ghost can testify that what you just said is true. Brother Durrant speaks of how you came on a mission with a big bundle of desire, surrounded with a good supply of hope that you would be a bold missionary. Because of that hope and desire to be a bold messenger of the truth, it doesn't matter if you are a quick learner or slow learner, tough guy or wimp, social butterfly or wall flower, extraordinary or ordinary, impressive of unimpressive, confident or fearful, because on your mission you CAN and will be bold. Alma told his son Shiblon, "Use boldness but not overbearance..." When you have the Spirit, you are bold. If you're just trying to do it on your own, you're overbearing.

If you sincerely invite the Spirit to be with you, you will never be alone. By following the whisperings of the Holy Ghost, you will know the will of the Lord. When you follow such promptings you can boldly teach truths, extend invitations, and make promises in the name of Jesus Christ. Knowing these things is the very key to being spiritually bold. As a missionary, you do not speak for yourself, you speak for the Lord. The seeds of boldness are within you. If you do not resist the enticing of the Holy Spirit these seeds will grow and you will be the means of doing much good. The message of the Lord will come THROUGH you to many others. Their entire eternity will be altered because you were bold in teaching them the truth.

It is my prayer that you will be a spiritually bold missionary. President Carter and I love you and pray for your happiness. Sister Carter
