This week I must say goodbye to the broken dirt roads of Artashat, the smell of burning trash in the afternoons, the squatting papiks, beautiful Mount Ararat, the missionaries I've served alongside of, and the people I've given my heart to for the past 18 months. Literally serving with all of my heart, might, mind, and strength.

As I say goodbye I must leave behind a people who I have laughed with, cried with, taught, and been taught by. Perhaps they shall never know the impact they have truly had on my life- because in losing myself to serve them- I truly *found myself*. As much as I know God loves me, I know he loves the people of Armenia.

I suppose I came on this mission to teach these people- but I think perhaps I am returning having gained far greater knowledge than I came with. Before my mission I thought I was strong. I was independent and self sustaining and often did not accept help from others. I called it stubbornness-the scriptures call it pride. However, throughout my mission I have come to know of the weakness that Ether, Jacob, and so many prophets teach us about.
