To our beloved missionaries of the Guatemala-El Salvador Mission (1970-73):

Greetings and muchos abrazos to each and every one of you. Hopefully, many of you will be able to attend the Mission Reunion on Friday, October 3, 2008 at the Salt Lake Parley's Third Ward (our home ward).

How time flies! It seems only yesterday that we completed our three year mission assignment, returning home to Salt Lake City in July of 1973, just in time for the big parade celebration of July 24th. It has been 35 years since we arrived home! You may recall we brought our four children; Scott, Bryant, Gary and Allison to the mission field with us. Scott, our oldest son was called to the Hermosilla Mexican Mission about six months after our arriving in Guatemala. Our daughter Allison turned 8 years old while we were in the mission. She was baptized in "The Waters of Mormon" (Lake Atitlan) near the lake home of John and Carmen O'Donnal. Bryant our next oldest son, completed high school in Guatemala, returned home to attend BYU before being called to the La Paz Bolivia Mission. Our youngest son, Gary, returned home with us, was an all state soccer player in high school before being called to serve his mission in the Chile Santiago North mission. The four children have all been married in the Salt Lake Temple and have produced 16 wonderful grand children and at last count we have 20 great grandchildren with another on the way in October and a set of twins due in about 5 months.

Sister Glade has developed Alzheimers so her short term memory is nonexistent, but her physical health and that of mine seems to be just fine!

During our three year tenure in the mission we estimate there were approximately 450 missionaries (elders, sisters and married couples) that served. They all proved to be outstanding brothers and sisters in the gospel and it was truly an honor and a privilege to serve with each and everyone. Our mission involved both countries and we attempted to give each missionary opportunities to serve where they were needed most. Some of our elders preferred the Indian program; some of our sisters were called as Health missionaries, and the couple missionaries were called to agriculture and leadership training assignments. We all played a part in laying a solid mission foundation. Today there are two missions in El Salvador and four missions in Guatemala. A temple has been built in Guatemala City and a new temple is being built in Quetzaltenango (Xela). Each mission now has about the same compliment of missionaries that we enjoyed at any one time in the two countries.

All of you can feel proud of your accomplishments during your missionary service. We congratulate you and wish our Father in Heavens choices blessings to be upon each and every one of you as well as your family members. We express to each of you our warmest personal regards, and appreciation for your faithful service and most of all, our LOVE.
