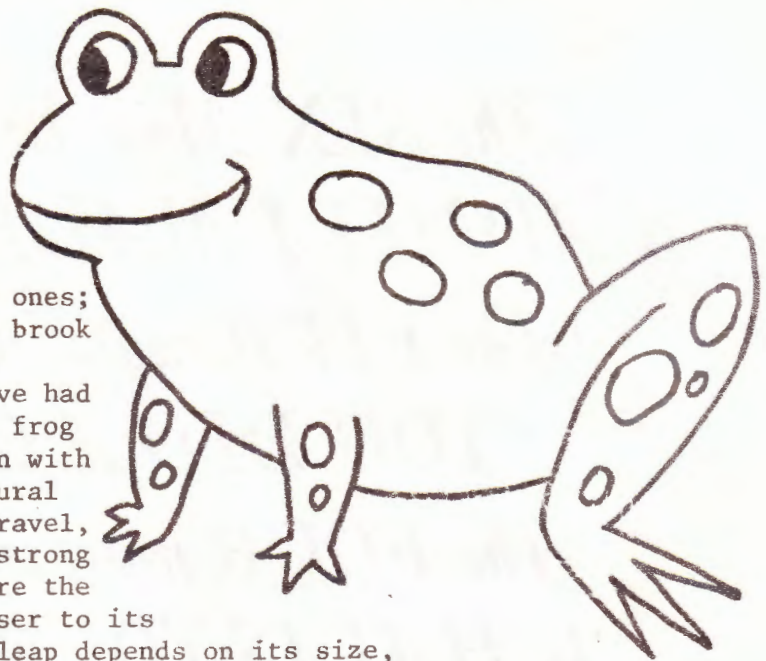

"LEAPFROG"



The frog is a creature that we are all rather familiar with. We have read stories about enchanted ones; heard them at night croaking in a brook or pool nearby; studied them in a biology lab, in essence we all have had some contact with the animal. The frog (*rana castesbiana*) is an amphibian with aquatic habits known for its guttural sounds and ability to leap. To travel, the frog leaps, propelled by its strong muscular legs. To get most anywhere the frog jumps and gets that much closer to its destination. The distance it can leap depends on its size, but frogs can generally leap over leaves, rocks, twigs, and other frogs. Rather than walking over or slithering around some obstacle, it merely jumps over leaving it behind. Its mode of travel gave rise to the childhood game of leapfrog which we all have played.

Many times when we get older, we tend to cling to our childhood game of leapfrog. But rather than leaping over playmates we begin to leap over time, responsibilities and opportunities. We leapfrog ahead in our minds, ignoring the present. We pass by that which is actually happening and worry about that which has not yet happened. Instead of enjoying and growing from realities, we vegetate on possibilities.

There is a song in the Church that deals with this thought. "Today while the sun shines, work with a will..." All the verses touch on this, but the chorus pretty well sums it up:

Today, today, work with a will
Today, today, your duties fulfil.
Today, today, work while you may
There is no tomorrow, but only today.

Missionary life is a reality. With all its sore feet and tired legs; broken visits and unmet challenges; its good baptisms and active families; strong branches and progressing church organizations, missionary work is a very real thing.
