

O, remember, my son, and learn wisdom in thy youth; yea, learn in thy youth to keep the commandments of God.

Yea, and cry unto God for all thy support; yea, let all thy doings be unto the Lord, and whithersoever thou goest let it be in the Lord; yea, let thy thoughts be directed unto the Lord; yea, let the affections of thy heart be placed upon the Lord forever.

Counsel with the Lord in all thy doings, and he will direct thee for good; yea, when thou liest down at night lie down unto the Lord, that he may watch over you in your sleep; and when thou risest in the morning let thy heart be full of thanks unto God; and if ye do these things, ye shall be lifted up at the last day.

A prepared missionary in the lands of Guatemala and El Salvador, which the Lord has prepared for a rich harvest, will work miracles if he is prepared to receive confidence and trust from the Lord. When "preparation meets opportunity", there is no limit to success.

May the Lord bless you to this end: that you might fulfill your destined purpose from the foundation of the Lord's creatures.

## MOTIVATIONS

Dear Fellow Missionaries:

I would like to take this opportunity to refresh our memories a little on a subject very dear and important to each one of our hearts. Permit me to copy a small part of a letter we all received.

"Your presiding officers have recommended you as one worthy to represent the Church of our Lord as a Minister of the Gospel. It will be your duty to live righteously, to keep the commandments of the Lord, to honor the holy Priesthood which you bear, to increase your testimony of the divinity of the Restored Gospel of Jesus Christ, to be an exemplar in your life of all the Christian virtues, and so to conduct yourself as a devoted servant of the Lord that you may be an effective advocate and messenger of the Truth. We repose in you our confidence and extend to you our prayers that the Lord will help you thus to meet your responsibilities.

"The Lord will reward the goodness of your life, and greater blessings and more happiness than you have yet experienced await you as you serve Him humbly and prayerful in this labor of love among His children."

Missionaries, when we sent back our acceptance of that call, we agreed to the things set forth as standards by which we would live. Do we still remember the covenants we made, or are we becoming lax and forgetful of the great responsibility we have taken upon ourselves as Ambassadors of the Lord. The letter admonishes us to "honor the holy Priesthood which you bear." The Doctrine and Covenants tells us:

For whose is faithful unto the obtaining these two priesthoods of which I have spoken, and the magnifying of their calling, are sanctified by the Spirit unto the renewing of their bodies. (D & C 84:33)

In order for us to be sanctified, we have to do more than fast and pray----we have to dedicate ourselves completely to the will of the Lord by giving ourselves over to the whisperings of the Spirit and the building up of the latter-day Zion. We read this promise in the Book of Mormon:

And blessed are they who shall seek to bring forth my zion at that day, for they shall have the gift and the power of the Holy Ghost; and if they endure unto the end they shall be lifted up at the last day, and shall be saved in the everlasting kingdom of the Lamb; and whoso shall publish peace, yea, tidings of great joy, how beautiful upon the mountains shall they be.

I remember a story I once heard given by a Dale Carnegie representative at a stake fireside. He told of a member of a symphony orchastra some years ago who was going blind. He got to the point that he had to put his music up close to his face to even see it .......... So, he decided to memorize all the music. By his efforts, he finally memorized not only the entire repertoire for his instrument, but for the rest of the orchestra as well. One night, a catastrophe struck. The tickets were sold, the advertisement was out — the concert had to go ahead as scheduled, but the conductor couldn't come. At the last minute, this member of the orchestra was called upon to direct the group for the performance. Although he was only 21 years old, the performance was magnificent. Who was the man? Arturo Toscanini, who later became leader of the NBC Orchestra, and was hailed as the greatest conductor of all time.

This man didn't waver in the face of adversity. He had a potential to develop. His hardship forced him to find his strength.

Then what's the process? First, let's set a goal—a goal that taxes that inner personal potential, not just that outer desire for gratification. Second, let's challenge ourselves to accomplish that goal. It can be done. Third, let's not just sit back and wait for results. We're responsible for our goal's fulfillment. Fourth, out of the corner of our eye, as we work, let's watch the goal slowly but surely realize itself.

Can we do it? You bet we can!






