Nephi & Lehi did it!

Fellow Missionaries:

Around 30 B.C. "Nephi delivered up the judgment-seat to a man whose name was Cezoram." The people in the land around about had become very wicked. "Nephi had become weary because of their iniquity; and he yielded up the judgment-seat and took it upon him to preach the word of God all the remainder of his days, and his brother Lehi also, all the remainder of his days."

And Helaman had taught his sons, "and they did remember his words; and therefore they went forth, keeping the commandments of God, to teach the word of God among all the people of Nephi, beginning at the city Bountiful;

"And from thenceforth to the city of Gid; and from the city of God to the city of Mulek;

"And even from one city to another, until they had gone forth among all the people of Nephi who were in the land southward; and from thence into the land of Zarahemla, among the Lamanites.

"And it came to pass that Nephi and Lehi did preach unto the Lamanites with such great power and authority, for they had power and authority, given unto them that they might speak, and they also had what they should speak given unto them —

"Therefore they did speak unto the great astonishment of the Lamanites, to the convincing them, insomuch that there were eight thousand of the Lamanites who were in the land of Zarahemla and round about baptized unto repentance, and were convinced of the wickedness of the traditions of their fathers."

We are preaching to the decendents of these very same people which the sons of Helaman taught. Our goal therefore must relate to the goals of Nephi and Lehi. As we have announced, our goal this year is 8,000 converts. To accomplish this, we must baptize an average of 1,000 of these brethern and sisters each month for the remainder of this year.

I am sure we have all felt the same desires that Alma expresses so beautifully in these lines:

"O that I were an angel, and could have the wish of mine heart, that I might go forth and speak with the trump of God, with a voice to shake the earth, and any repentance unto every people!

"Yea, I would declare unto every soul, as with the voice of thunder, representance and the plan of redemption, that they should repent and come unto our God, that there might not be more sorrow upon all the face of the earth.

"But behold, I am a man, and do sin in my wish; for I ought to be content with the things which the Lord hath allotted unto me." (Alma 29:1-3)

In Alma's yearnings to cry repentance to all the world, he mentions that he would like to "speak with the trump of God;" the Doctrine and Covenants also meantions the trump of God. In the first five verses of Section 75, we, as missionaries, and to be mighty in our proclamation of these things: "lifting up your voices as with the sound of a trump." (D & C 75:4) The earnest missionary's message can have the effect of a trump in that he can be heard far and wide by all who will tune their east to his voice, but in order to make his trump heard, he has to blow with a mighty blast! Brigham Young, in one of his discourses, said:

"When I first commenced preaching, I made up my mind to declare the things that I understood, fearless of friends and threats, and regardless of caresess. They were nothing to me, for if it was my duty to rise before a congregation of strangers and say that the Lord lives, that He has revealed Himself in this one day, that He has given to us a Prophet, and brought forth the new and every ing covenant for the restoration of Israel, and if that was all I could say, I must be just as satisfied as though I could get up and talk for hours...

"With regard to preaching, let a man present himself before the Saints, or go into the world before the nobles and great men of the earth, and let him stand up full of the Holy Ghost, full of the power of God, and though he had use words and sentences in an awkward style, he will convince and convert motor of the truth, than can the most polished orator destitute of the Holy Ghost; for that Spirit will prepare the minds of the people to receive the truth, and the spirit of the speaker will influence the hearers so that they will feel it."


Let's be the progress-making builders on this highway of the future.

The Process:

- 1. Make short, periodic visits to the outstanding members of your branch or ward.
- 2. Create their confidence in you by your actions and your respect for them. This confidence is vital to their developing a desire to give you the names of their closest friends.
- 3. Emphasize President McKay's "Every Member a Missionary" goal and their responsibility to "warn their neighbor."
- 4. Encourage them to invite their friends into their homes to meet the Elders and receive the first discussion.
- 5. Begin to talk in terms of their investigators rather than yours. Make them feel an obligation to see that their investigators are taken to Church and reminded of the times of your subsequent visits.
- 6. If they have sufficient Priesthood authority, let them baptize the converts, thus highlighting the culmination of their contribution and encouraging them to keep the program moving forward.


