Excerps from the April 68 conference talk by Franklin D. Richards
Assistant to the Council of the Twelve.

"As early as 1831 the Lord, in a revelation given to the Prophet Joseph Smith, counseled the Elders of the Church to 'Be not weary in well-doing, for ye are laying the foundation of a great work. And out of small things proceeded that which is great.' (D&C 64:33)

How important this counsel is to us today: be not weary in well-doing.'

Be patient in your home teaching an other teaching assingments, in your home

evenings, and in all relationships with one another.

I recall that in our stake mission our missionaries called on one non-member family at least once every three months, covering a period of two and a half years, but were never invited into the home. Then on the next visit they were invited in. This family was then taught the gospel. As they studied, prayed, and attended church, they recieved testimonies and were baptized.

The reward of patiently presevering in this case was the bringing of an entire family into the kingdom of God.

As one reviews the various areas of life's activities and appreciates the many human inadequacies, the great value of patience becomes more and more evident.

Under such circumstances, patience will develop with in us the capacity to accept criticism and censure, whether we feel such criticism is warranted or not. This ability to exercise forbearance under provocation means that we are following the Savior's teachings, to do good to those who despitefully use us and to turn the other check.



Excerps from talk given Oct. 4, 1968 by Elder Delbert L. Stapley of the council of the twelve.

The Lord, speaking through Joseph Smith, the latter-day Prophet, admonished the Saints: "But ye are commanded in all things to ask of God, who giveth liberally; and that which the Spirit testifies unto you even so I would that ye should do in all holiness of heart, walking uprightly before me, considering the end of your salvation, doing all things with prayer and thanksgiving, that ye may not be seduced by evil spirits, or doctrines of devils, or the commandments of man; for some are of men, and others of devils." (D&C 46:7)

Again he said to the Prophet, "Hearken ye to these words. Behold I am Jesus Christ, the Savior of the world, Treasure these things up in your hearts, and let the solemnities of eternity rest upon your minds".

To love God with all our heart, might, mind, and strength is our first and most important commitment. Without our eternal God, who is the Father of our spirits, we would not exist. 




