Dear Fellow Missionaries:

"Corporations pay thousands of dollars annually to efficiency consultants. These men are paid to go through a business operation, department by department, to observe, make time-and-motion studies, and give suggestions on how time and money might be saved. In a manufacturing plant they will use stop watches to time each movement of a worker. They will measure and time the cycle that each worker goes through in order to perform his part of the operation. A like precess will also occur in the offices — the time to type a letter — distance from the stenographer's desk to the mail slot — all of these things are measured and compared."

Just a few minutes a day can save a missionary hours. It can be done in the evening or early in the morning. First, a review of the previous day's activities must be discussed in order to determine if the goals of the day were accomplished. Then secondly, a schedule for the day's activities should be drawn up. Write the schedule on the organization sheets to have the day's activities in front of you.

As it has been stated, organization is the day to effectiveness. In order to show forth our potential we must be creative. In order to create or make something it has to be done in an organized manner. We all want to be the best missionaries, but in order to be the best we have to work effectively, to work effectively we have to be organized.

3 point bonus


Winners of the contest are determined on a point structure basis.

- 2. All eight year old baptisms are considered as one point only.
- 3. Adults are those 18 years old and over and those who are under 18 years of age and married. These are considered eligible in the point structure of 4 points for men and 2 points for women.
- 4. All children 9 years old and over who were not baptized when the other members of the family were baptized, but were baptized at a later date will be counted as completing a family and will receive a bonus of 3 points.
- 5. If any of the children of a family are married then the married children and the parents are counted as different families.
- 6. If the mother or father is dead or diversed then those remaining are counted as a family. If there is a guardian then the guardian is counted as part of the family.
- 7. Those living away from home (in school, in the service, etc.) and return after the family is baptized are counted as completing a family.



PAYMENT OF MEDICAL EXPENSES

When a missionary contracts an illness that requires hospitalization, he should notify at once either the Second Assistant or the Zone Leader. The Zone Leader will in turn notify the Second Assistant of the nature of the illness, the time required for recuperation, and that the missionary has notified his parents of his illness and entrance into the hospital.

Since the billing system is different here than in the United States, the missionary should instruct the hospital that he, personally, must sign, after a complete and satisfactory explanation, all charges. This will give the Mission a control over indescreet charging. He should then direct the hospital to send these charges to the Mission Office. The Mission Office will then pay all costs. At the time of payment, the missionary will be charged \$10,00 for the doctor's bills and \$30.00 for the hospital bills.

As soon as possible the missionary should institute action to recover as much of the total expenditure as possible from his insurance company. The canceled billings will be available to the missionary for insurance purposes. Since the Mission will have paid the hospital and doctor bills, please specify to the insurance company that the "Misión Guatemalteco - Salvadoreña" be the payee.
